GKA is a boutique firm of architects established in Fremantle, Western Australia in 1993, following a successful partnership between Martin Grounds and Jack Kent in creating the groundbreaking, internationally renowned and multiple award winning Four Seasons Resort at Jimbaran Bay, Bali.

Over the past 30 years GKA have designed culturally unique resort hotel and tourism projects in countries such as Australia, China, India, Indonesia, Barbados, Maldives, Fiji, Malaysia, Thailand, Myanmar, Vietnam, Morocco and Tanzania, with an emphasis always on the use of local natural materials, culturally appropriate design and an empathy with topography and environment.

GKA firmly believe that where possible architecture should involve and reflect local conditions, materials and traditions, developing an interpretation of local building culture, the involvement of local tradespeople and use of local materials is reflected in everything we do. Our projects provide guests and visitors with an authentic "sense of place" unique to the location.

Residential Design

We approach each project, be it commercial or residential, with consistent level of rigour, values and goals, and work closely to align with the aspirations and objectives of each client.

Site analysis, climatic analysis and research into each site's specific qualities, along with neighbouring environment are brought together in an artful yet pragmatic way to fashion a bespoke product for its time, place and owner.

It is recognised as the first all villa resort hotel, each with private plunge pool, with the design based on the traditional model of a Balinese residence extrapolated into a 5 star experience that imbues its place whilst delivering the highest levels of service and guest experience.

Since these beginnings, GKA have created numerous resorts, and affiliated residential developments all around the globe that embed many of these foundational principles.


Capabilities

GKA won a limited competition with a brief to design WA's premier aged care development, to break the norms and standard approaches, and together with a dedicated team of consultants and architects to produce a new benchmark development for aged care living with the outcome and its success in use and honours speaking for itself.



PEPPERMINT GROVE RESIDENCE

Location - Peppermint Grove, WA

Project Summary

This Western Australian residence is situated on a corner site with unobstructed 180 degree views of the Swan River and Perth City beyond. The home's design and materials were conceived to best express the horizontal and showcase the nature of the panoramic landscape and extraordinary views.

The architectural composition of the home takes advantage of site conditions, prevailing winds, sun penetration, and light. The roof form was envisaged as slender horizontal wings, which float over the glass, masonry and steel structure below.

The home is nestled into a steep river bank and limestone cliff. From both the interiors and from the expansive exterior terraces, the home allows for uninterrupted river views as well as providing a comfortable aesthetic relationship with the site and its surrounding context.

The lower ground floor is anchored into the site and showcases horizontal patterned limestone blocks which reference the natural limestone cliff it is built upon.

Location - Peppermint Grove. WA


Project Summary


This luxury residence is located on a corner site in the prominent and sought after river side street of leafy Peppermint Grove. The corner lot had some significant falls towards the river enabling a three-storey solution to maximise its idyllic location.

The roof line hence was designed as a low slung wide eave roof to stay under required height restrictions, with a stylish side elevation of beautiful natural stone and floating roof lines breaking the form down, and massing down away from the corner, integrating well in its well established streetscape.

The residence has been clad in customised split sandstone cladding echoing the neighbourhood in a modern interpretation, with much of the interior having a very high level of finely crafted timber veneers and spectacular Italian kitchen that breaks out to the rear private courtyard space and pool area that captures the northern sunlight









This project is the home of GKA Architectures Director Scott Bradley and was a fantastic opportunity to explore design and materiality to create a resort feel residence suitable for young family and casual lifestyle. The property has an ideal Northern orientation with the rear of the property falling away to the rear boundary enabling the new works to be stepped down the site whilst staying below the roof line of the existing cottage. This maintains an understated quality from the street, whilst providing generous volumes to the newly created spaces. The addition was envisaged as a 'pavilion in the garden' to lightly join the existing 1930's home and celebrate and occupy its garden setting.

The new living dining pavilion is connected via a glassed linkway, creating central courtyard spaces that provides natural light into the heart of the residence, and enables ideal cross ventilation. The living pavilion, when opened up, essentially acts as a breezeway in the garden with significant double sliding doors to both the North and South.

The home was in fact an major remodelling of an existing framed residence, which has been extensively remodelled and expanded, and is appointed with top tier appliances and finishes akin to the quality

SALT VILLAGE RESIDENCE

Location - Kingscliff, NSW

Project Summary

Another repeat client, this Salt Village home was designed to reflect the spirit of a luxurious GKA resort designed for the client in Port Douglas, but also had to respect the Queensland coastal location, which is windier and cooler than its tropical counterparts.

The home is comprised of two stories, and features open air walkways, pavilions, courtyards, stone and water features all showcasing a strong Balinese architectural influence.

The central axis, including a breezeway, leads through a series of courtyards on each side, providing cross ventilation and open plan living. The uniquely designed pool plays with differing levels to minimise the need for fencing, while still showcasing the infinity edge at eye level. The corner of the main living area has full height glazed doors which when open, provide a living space that is virtually an outdoor room.

The kitchen, whilst highly practical and functional, features walnut timber fronts to the island bench, making it appear more like a piece of floating furniture than a utilitarian item. The master suite on the first floor continues the tropical theme. A luxurious bath nook is wrapped in kwila timber battens, enhances the sense of intimacy and retreat opening up to a small deck overlooking the picturesque coastline





QUEENSCLIFF RESIDENCE


Location - Queenscliff, NSW

Project Summary

Perched on the edge of a small cliff face in picturesque Queenscliffe NSW, faced with a complex site, the residence was concieved as an upside down house with dual aspect.

The residence opens to panoramic views of both Queencliffe and Manly Beaches, as well as connecting to the Manly Lagoon below, the later being accentuated by a canitilevered glass fronted pool.

Carved back into the sandstone cliff the residence also opens back up to the North to let in precious north light throughout, also providing ideal cross ventilation to the project.













NORTH FREMANTLE RESIDENCE Location - North Fremantle, WA

North Fremantle was originally known for its iconic warehouses and mixture of both light and heavy industry. By 2004 this corner site was one of very few remaining warehouses left as the inevitable development of affluent residential properties transformed the suburb.

As with most warehouses the walls were built from boundary to boundary with no setbacks. To knock the building down was to lose the opportunity to utilize this unique, no setback structure situated ideally on the narrowest strip of land between the Swan River and Indian Ocean.

In redeveloping the building from warehouse to residence, the design objective was to peel the top off the existing building leaving only the outside walls, and inserting a new exposed steel frames 'factory like' structure within the existing walls. The result is a contemporary three storey residence flooded with light, space, a private north facing entry courtyard garden, and a strong referential industrial aesthetic throughout.

Opposite the site and in the view of the upper floors of the new residence is the amazing and extensive steel and glass facade of the original Ford car factory. The elevation of the new residence references the materials, fenestration rhythm and industrial elegance of the old factory, and celebrates the rich history of both transformed buildings.

Project Summary

DINNER PLAIN DISPLAY HOUSE

Location - Dinner Plain, Victorian Snowfields

Project Summary

This house was designed to be an exemplar of luxury residential in the snow, and to demonstrate a new level of quality unseen at that point in the unique township of Dinner Plain, which was conceived as a residential village to support Mt Hotham ski slopes.

The project was the brainchild of Tony Canon from the Ray Group, whom had the vision to advance the slightly tired Dinner Plain village, to becoming a new benchmark for luxury tourism increasing value with the aim to set a new benchmark for the village. Dinner Plain is in fact the highest freehold land in Australia and is recently also blossoming in the off season tourism for nature trails, hikes, horse riding etc..

The display house designed by GKA celebrates its snowy gum lined location, with days beds, a spectacular four person spa located in the centre of the living spaces, as well as a beautiful well-appointed master suite, the house sparing no expense with use of natural timbers and top level Italian design fit out. GKA worked jointly with Giovanni Di Ambrosio for the internal fit out with the outcome creating a world class holiday home.

Once again, this project was for a repeat client of GKA's, and interesting we have since been reengaged by the new owner for further works at the adjoining Onsen Day Spa.





COTTESLOE TOWNHOUSES

Location - Cottesloe, WA

Project Summary

Situated in an established neighbourhood of old character and heritage homes, not so old apartments and a street lined with the ever presence Cottesloe Norfold pines, this duplex development explores the following; context, the maximizing of given space, desired amenity and offering the owners a contemporary and crafted home.

Modern, yet sympathetic the their surrounds the solution investigates a pavilion / courtyard model allowing good north light and cross ventilation to all habitable rooms, accentuated by the use of staggered 'blade' walls with large, fully operable glass walls, opening internal spaces up to courtyards. Open planning and large volumes also aid in the feeling of space, with lofty floating gable roofs framing the surrounding Norfolk's.

A contemporary palette of concrete floors, glass face render walls, steel joinery, timber veneer ceilings and cabinetry was developed, contrasted yet complemented by a subtle theme of curves throughout the projects detailing.

The separation of pavilions is accentuated by a glass 'bridge like' gallery link. The upper floor has a trafficable glass ellipse and downstairs the gallery of boarded by a water feature traversed by large stepping stones.





MT CLAREMONT RESIDENCE


Location - Mt Claremont, WA

Project Summary

A repeat client contacted GKA to create their family home in Mt Claremont having completed a holiday home for them in Eagle Bay. The home was to be energy efficient and low maintenance given their time is split from this and their second home down south.

The house is designed to maximize northern orientation and outlook, with all living Dining Kitchen and alfresco capitalize on the northern outlook with allowance for good cross ventilation throughout given the linear layout. Warm materials were used such as natural stone and extensive timber floors and ceilings are incorporated to help provide a natural yet robust outcome. The design also catered for a extended family allowing flexibility of use whilst bringing the family together in the communal areas.













Located in the quiet well treed cul-de-sac this residence offers the owners a secluded tranquility followed through from planning, to materials and finishes.

Ocean and tree top views are obtained from the north facing upstairs sitting room, master bedroom and large balcony area. Large ground floor living and dining areas open up with dual orientation to a large northern court and a more intimate central courtyard area, giving good northern orientation as well as ideal cross ventilation to all the major rooms.

The house is arranged around a series of courtyards, bringing the outdoors in. The front court has some magnificent established trees integrated with the new home and has been elevated from street level to retain privacy while maximizing on its northern orientation.

The central court is more introspective with large stepping stones and a water spout feature wall spilling into a large Balinese pot perched on a natural green stone pond and pedestal. This court, while mostly enclosed, provides a more sheltered and secluded environment while being quite decorative.

Location - Cottesloe, WA

Project Summary





BUNKER BAY RESIDENCE Location - Bunker Bay, WA

This residence was one of a number of private residences completed by GKA following their creation of the Bunkey Bay Resort. As part of this development GKA were charged with creating multiple housing types for each lot type, plus creation of design guidelines and standards for any further private residential lots that surround the resort. The intent being that estate remain a harmonious combination of private luxury residential that complement the greater resort and can be read as one entire masterplanned project in its sensitive coastal location.

Situated on one of the beachfront lots this residence is a good example of the prototypes designed by GKA, albeit with some site specific tweaks such as creating a split level arrival to create an upper level living dining kitchen area, maximising views and connectivity to the beach.

This created some unique opportunities and bespoke resolutions unique to this scheme and worked within the established guidelines. The use of natural materials, such as stone and timber, soft curved roofs combined with simple gable roof lines creates a residence that is truly reflective of the award winning Bunker Bay Resort in both form and materiality


